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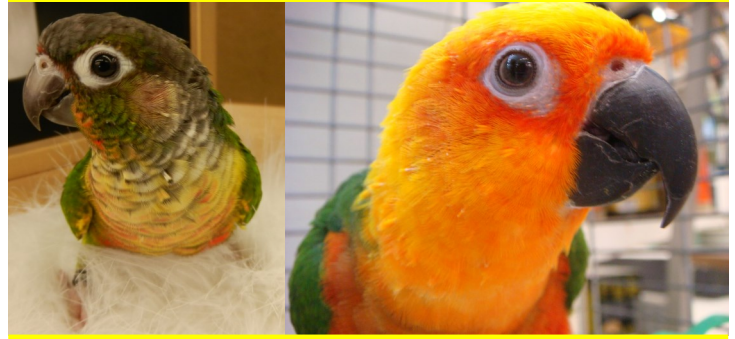
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CONURES

Pyrrhura sp. + Aratinga sp.



ADULT SIZE: 10 - 15 inches

NATIVE TO: Subtropical and tropical regions of Central and South America.

GROUPING: In the wild, conures are normally found in small flocks. They bond best when you have just one bird; especially with lots of attention and training. If you're short on time, get more than one.

HABITAT: The larger the cage, the better. The cage must be large enough for your bird to fully spread its wings without touching the sides of the cage and without the tail feathers touching the bottom of the cage. Bar spacing is 1/2" or less. Stainless steel or powder-coated; do **not** use toxic metals like zinc or lead. Secure cage doors and windows. Keep a few different sized perches in the cage to exercise your bird's feet. Cover the cage at night.

BEDDING: Cover the bottom of the cage with a thin layer of un-scented, dust-free litter such as crushed walnut. **NEVER** use cedar.

HABITAT CARE: Change litter at least once a week; spot clean daily. Hand wash food and water bowls frequently. Scrub perches as needed. Create a spray bottle of diluted bleach solution. (1 part bleach/ 9 parts water) Every few weeks, remove the bird and dump the litter tray. Spray the cage, litter tray, perches, and toys; let it sit for 10 minutes. Use a damp towel to wipe down cage and perches. It will air dry. **Avoid using chemical cleaners around your pet as they are very sensitive to the fumes.**

TEMPERATURE: 65°-80°. **Don't place cage in drafty areas, under ceiling fans, AC vents, or in direct sunlight.**

WATER: Fresh water should be available at all times. Clean and refill the water bowl daily. To prevent feces from getting in water, use a covered water bowl or avoid placing water bowl directly under a perch.

DIET: A varied diet is essential. **70%** is a nutritionally-complete pelleted diet. **30%** is seed mixes, tree nuts, whole-grains, and fresh veggies and fruit. Remove any fruits or vegetables not eaten within 24 hours. Add a vitamin supplement to the water to fill in any gaps in nutrition. **Do NOT feed avocado, fruit pits/seeds, chocolate, caffeine, sugar, or fatty foods.** See our "Feeding Guide for Birds" for a detailed list of foods.

GROOMING: Conures enjoy an occasional bath. Provide a bowl large enough for your bird to get into, or mist with warm water. Keep their flight feathers clipped to prevent injury or escape. Trim nails as needed. A cuttlebone in the cage will provide minerals and keep your bird's beak in good condition.

HANDLING & TEMPERAMENT: Conures are affectionate and **require daily interaction.** Their humans are their flock so they want to be where you are; put the cage in the room where you spend the most time.

EXERCISE: Provide exercise and playtime to promote good health. To keep your bird mentally stimulated, offer a variety of toys. Buy extra toys and rotate them every few weeks to keep things interesting. Allow your bird supervised time out of the cage with your family; a table top perch or play stand is great for this purpose.

OTHER: Toxic fumes can be deadly. **DO NOT USE Teflon or other non-stick pots/pans with a bird in the house; when these pans are heated up they can release a toxic gas that can kill your bird. Also avoid air-borne chemicals such as cigarettes/vapes, hair spray, scented candles, carpet cleaners, and air fresheners while your bird is in the room.**

VETERINARY CARE: You may wish to schedule a check-up for your new pet. Consult your vet and keep their number handy in case of an emergency.
